Provide 24 – hour crisis intervention services.

Assist police with death notifications, critical incidents, and/or traumatic events.

Offer violent crime support; in cases of domestic violence, child abuse, elder abuse, and sexual abuse.

Assist with juvenile concerns and family conflicts.

Address homelessness and/or poverty.

Provide specialized social services in a multi-disciplinary approach (human services and law enforcement).

Assist in crime prevention and in the reduction of recidivism rates.
